Council on Academic Affairs Minutes December 8, 2011

The December 8, 2011 meeting of the Council on Academic Affairs was held at 2:00 p.m. in Room 4440, Booth Library.

I. Approval of the December 1, 2011 CAA Meeting Minutes.

Dr. Reid moved and Dr. Klarup seconded the motion to approve the minutes. The minutes of December 1, 2011 were approved as written.

II. Communications:

a. College Curriculum Committee Minutes:

1. November 28, 2011 minutes of the College of Education & Professional Studies Curriculum Committee meeting.

b. Waiver Reports:

 Academic Waiver Report for November 2011 from Lumpkin College of Business & Applied Sciences, College of Arts & Humanities, College of Education & Professional Studies, and College of Sciences.

There were questions about denied waiver 11-96 and approved waiver 11-97 on the Lumpkin College of Business & Applied Sciences waiver report. Under the description for waiver 11-96, it says the waiver was approved by department chair. However, the waiver was listed under the denied waiver section of the report. As a result, it was unclear whether the item had actually been approved or denied. Also, it was unclear which department chair(s) approved both waiver 11-96 and 11-97 since a name for the department chair(s) wasn't provided on the report for those two waivers. Dr. Mitchell indicated he could get clarification from the college about it.

Also, it was noted that the name of the individuals approving and/or denying waivers were not included on the waiver reports from the College of Arts & Humanities and College of Education & Professional Studies. It was suggested that it would be helpful if waiver reports from every college would include a statement identifying who approves and denies each waiver request. Dr. Mitchell indicated he would contact all of the colleges to request it.

In regards to the College of Sciences waiver report, it was noted that an action statement indicating whether the item was approved wasn't included in the description for waivers 11-89, 11-90, and 11-92 and the header "Approved Waivers" was missing from the report. Also, Ms. Fopay failed to remove the name of a student from the report she gave the CAA Executive Committee earlier in the week. However, the name was removed from the report that was attached to the CAA agenda sent to council members this week. It was clarified that the names shouldn't be included on the reports distributed with the agenda.

c. Other:

 November 28, 2011 email from Dr. Les Hyder, Journalism, regarding concerns about the Office of Executive Inspector General. Note: Dr. Hyder also sent the email to the Council of Chairs, Council on Teacher Education, Council on Graduate Studies, and Faculty Senate. A few of the council members commented on the communication. It was suggested by a council member that the communication be sent to office administrators (excluding department chairs since the communication has already been sent to the Council of Chairs) to share with staff and those who handle the budget in their departments.

An option in the Art (B.F.A.) offerings.

Portfolio Review

Students wishing to pursue the BA or BFA with option in Studio Art **must** may apply for admission after earning a total of 45 semester hours of credit, complete the foundations program (Art 1000, 1001, 1110, 1111, 2601, 2602) and six semester hours of 2000 level studio courses (Art 2000, 2050, 2100, 2250, 2560, or 2700, or 2800), have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 for all coursework, and a minimum Studio Art GPA of 2.75, submit an electronic portfolio of artwork completed in foundations studio courses and 2000-level studio courses, and a one-page statement of intent. The portfolio of artwork will be reviewed and ranked by the Foundations and Studio Area faculty. Admission in the program is based on a comparative scoring system of performance in the above requirements (cumulative GPA, Studio Art GPA, completion of required coursework, portfolio of artwork, statement of intent).

Exceptions to these requirements can be made only in response to written requests and the subsequent review and recommendation of the Foundations and Studio Area faculty.

Core Requirements

The BFA in Art with Studio Art option requires a total of 80 semester hours. The option coursework consists of 35 semester hours of Studio Art and Art History courses common to both emphases and 45 semester hours of courses from the Two-Dimensional Emphasis OR the Three-Dimensional Emphasis.
