BIO 3460. Clinical Rotation. (3-3-4) Practical experience for pre-health professional tract students to obtain the hands-on experience needed to be competitive for admission to professional schools. The course requires at least 3 hours of clinical time per week that is arranged over the semester. Students will rotate between different health professional settings. In addition to the clinical rotation, students will meet with the course instructor 3 hours per week to reflect on components of their rotation. Prerequisites: A grade of "B" or better in BIO 2210 and BIO 2220, or BIO 3620. May not have previously taken BIO3960A-001 (CRN#93104 or CRN#39559 or CRN#99378).

1. Revise the course restrictions for PSY 3518.

PSY 3518 - Psychology of Language Development. (3-0-3) On Demand. Overview of how children typically progress in the development and use of language from birth to maturity, including examination of relevant issues, theoretical positions, and methodologies used in the study of language development. Topics may include the role of genetics, brain, and culture, as well as the development and use of language in special populations, such as bilingual children. Students receiving credit for CDS 2200 will not be allowed to receive credit for this course. This course is restricted to Psychology majors and BGS majors, General Studies majors and General Studies: Child Care Education majors. May not have previously taken PSY4585D-600 (CRN#38170) or PSY4585D-800 (CRN#38839); these are Special Topics in Psychology: Language Development courses. Prerequisites and Notes: A grade of "C" or better in PSY 1879. Credits: 3

COS**Effective Fall 2017**

1. Change the course title and course description for GEO 3320.

GEO 3320 - Natural Resource Management Conservation. (3-0-3) S. A topical and regional assessment of conservation management issues related to farmlands, wetlands, waterways, grasslands, forests, and other natural systems. Specific attention will be given to contemporary geographic issues affecting rural and agricultural landscapes conservation topics prevalent in the U.S., with specific studies focusing on east-central Illinois. Credits: 3

2. Amend the course title and course description for GEO 3330.

GEO 3330 - Food and Agriculture Agricultural Geography. (3-0-3) S. A topical and regional analysis of historic and current trends in agricultural practices and land use. Readings pertaining to how land is used, where our food, fuel, and fiber comes from, and geographic issues regarding sustainability will be central to our discussions. Specific attention will be given to U.S. agricultural systems and related issues. Credits: 3

3. Remove the following statement from the PLS 4503 course description: *A maximum of three semester hours may be applied to the major in political science.*

PLS 4503 - Independent Study. (Arr.-Arr.-1-6) Individual study of a topic of the student's choice under the supervision of an instructor. The student must submit a study plan for approval by the department chair and faculty supervisor prior to registration. Prerequisites and Notes: Six semester hours of political science, senior standing and permission of the department chairperson. Note: A maximum of six semester hours may be earned in this course. ~~A maximum of three semester hours may be applied to the major in political science.~~ Credits: 1 to 6

COS**Effective Spring 2018**

1. Update the prerequisites for GEO 4850.

GEO 4850 - Environmental Geology. (3-0-3) Study of natural and engineered interactions of contaminants and the geologic environment. Topics include types and analysis of common contaminants, surface and groundwater quality, risk analysis, U.S. environmental law, industrial and municipal waste disposal, and remediation techniques. Prerequisites and Notes: GEO 1300G or GEO 1320G or GEO 1390G; CHM 1410 or concurrent enrollment; and MAT 1330 (or MAT 1400) or concurrent enrollment, or permission of the instructor. Credits: 3
