EIU's number one priority is a Science Bldg.

Dr. Gatrell reported that the subcommittee met and reviewed the spend rate in Academic Affairs that is at about 67%. The dean positions in the College of Health and Human Services and the Lumpkin College of Business and Technology were filled. A new major was approved by CAA and is going to the Board of Trustees next month.
