- f. Administrative/Subcommittee Reports
 - i. President Administrative Report

Dr. Glassman reported that a lot of planning has taken place behind the scenes for the school year. Communication will continue to flow so everyone is informed as we move forward.

- Coles County is in the warning level we will continue to message safe practices to everyone.
- EIU tested 900 students last week; 24 students tested positive (2.56 % positivity rate), so the high positivity rate is based on the entire Coles County community.
- There is an increase in costs relating to COVID, such as sanitation crew, air purification systems.
- EIU received CARES Act money for students and for the institution. The money given to the institution is being used for testing.
- GEER funds flowed through the Governor's office for enrollment/retention of minority students.
- An additional \$200K has been received for technology.
- The Gail and Richard Lumpkin School of Nursing has completed all accreditations.
- The architectural firm has been selected for the new science building, and \$11.8M has been received for the design of the building.
- ii. <u>Vice President for Academic Affairs</u> No report.
- iii. Vice President for Business Affairs

Vice President Reeder reported that our appropriation for FY21 is flat and the Governor may ask for a 5% rescission of the budget. Paul McCann distributed and discussed the Line Item Status report for FY20 through June 30, 2020 (preliminary) and the FY21 budget.

iv. Vice President for Student Affairs

Dr. Anne Flaherty introduced herself to the Council. She has been on board for six weeks as the new Vice President for Student Affairs.

v. University Advancement

Vice President Wetstein reported that University Advancement receipted \$6.6M in FY20, a 194% increase over last year. An area for real focus this year is to increase the number of donors. The number of donors in FY20 was 4300, a decrease of 200 donors.
