To create a cohesive and integrated campus plan

- Zoning
- New building and field locations
- Circulation systems

To create a strong sense of campus orientation and definition

- Wayfinding

To support transportation patterns that encourage pedestrian traffic and enhance the safety and convenience of EIU students, faculty and staff

Function Goals

To plan for existing population
