



# Joseph


- ✤ 11<sup>th</sup> of 12 sons born to srael

# Typology for Christians of the Israelite Journey from Egypt

- Israelites in Egyptian bondage represents the sinners life bound by sin.
- Passover represents blood that Christ shed on Calvary's cross that cleanses a person from sin through repentance.
- ✤ Red Sea parting represents the water baptism of believers in Jesus' name (Acts 2:38, Romans 6:4).
- Crossing Jordan River into promised land of prepresents the believer being filled with the Holy

Dpirit.

#### Psalms 105:16-40

"Moreover he called for a famine upon the land: he brake the whole staff of bread. 17 He sent a man before them, even Joseph, who was sold for a servant: 18 Whose feet they hurt with fetters: he was laid in iron: 19 Until the time that his word came: the word of the LORD tried him. 20 The king sent and loosed him; even the ruler of the people, and let him go free.<sup>21</sup> He made him lord of his house, and ruler of all his substance: 22 To bind his princes at his pleasure; and teach his senators wisdom.<sup>23</sup> Israel also came into Egypt; and Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.<sup>24</sup> And he increased his people greatly; and made them stronger than their enemies.<sup>25</sup> He turned their heart to hate his people, to deal subtilly with his servants.<sup>26</sup> He sent Moses his servant; and Aaron whom he had chosen. 27 They shewed his signs among them, and wonders in the land of Ham. 28 He sent darkness, and made it dark; and they rebelled not against his word. 29 He turned their waters into blood, and slew their fish. <sup>30</sup> Their land brought forth frogs in abundance, in the chambers of their kings. 31 He spake, and there came divers sorts of flies, and lice in all their coasts. 32 He gave them hail for rain, and flaming fire in their land. 33 He smote their vines also and their fig trees; and brake the trees of their coasts. <sup>34</sup> He spake, and the locusts came, and caterpillers, and that without number, <sup>35</sup> And did eat up all the herbs in their land, and devoured the fruit of their ground. <sup>36</sup> He smote also all the firstborn in their land, the chief of all their strength. 37 He brought them forth also with silver and gold: and there was not one feeble person among their tribes. <sup>38</sup> Egypt was glad when they departed: for the fear of them fell upon them. "He spread a cloud for a covering; and fire to give light in the night."
