Prerequisites: MUS 3584 or MUS 3594 with a "C" or better, or permission of instructor; and admission to Departmental Honors. Equivalent Course: MUS 3585. WI

# 8. 17-67, MUS 4601A, B, D, Independent Study In Pedagogy and Literature (New Course).

FCS 3755. Nutrition Across the Lifespan. (3-0-3) On Demand. Concepts of normal human nutrition with emphasis on nutrient needs throughout the lifespan. Prerequisite: FCS 2100 or its equivalent. Restricted to students in the BS in FCS: Dietetics Option . A limit of 3 hours may be applied to a major or minor.

#### 14. 17-74, FCS 3756, Program Development for Community Nutrition (Revised Course).

Dr. Andrade presented the proposal. There are no questions.

Mr. Young moved and Dr. Kronenfeld seconded the motion to approve the proposal. The motion passed unanimously.

The proposal was approved, effective Fall 2017.

FCS 3756. Program Development for Community Nutrition. (3-0-3) On Demand. Factors influencing human nutrition needs and eating patterns and related counseling and educational techniques for use in the community setting. Prerequisite: FCS 2100 or its equivalent. Restricted to students in the BS in FCS: Dietetics Option and BS in Health Studies. A limit of 3 hours may be applied to a major or minor.

# 15. 17-75, FCS 3757, Nutrition for Physical Performance (was FCS 4755) (Revised Course; Online Delivery).

Dr. Andrade presented the proposal and answered questions of the council. The council requested revisions to the proposal.

Dr. Aylesworth moved and Mr. Aydt seconded the motion to approve the proposal. The motion passed unanimously.

The proposal, with revisions, was approved, effective Fall 2017. **NOTE:** FCS 4755 will be deleted as this is a course number change for that course

**FCS 3757. Nutrition for Physical Performance. (3-0-3) On Demand. Nutrition/Physical Performance.** Examination of metabolism and energy systems related to physical performance. Plan optimal diets for performance. Examination and evaluation of controversial practices that may influence metabolism and performance. Prerequisite: FCS 2100 or its equivalent. Restricted to students in the BS in FCS: Dietetics Option, BS in Kinesiology & Sports Studies: Exercise Science Concentration, and BS in Athletic Training. A limit of 3 hours may be applied to a major or minor.

# 16. 17-76, FCS 4749, Nutrition Therapy (was FCS 4751) (Revised Course).

Dr. Andrade presented the proposal and answered questions of the council.

Dr. Bruehler moved and Dr. Paulson seconded the motion to approve the proposal. The motion passed unanimously.

FCS 4749. Nutrition Therapy. (4-0-4) On Demand. Application of the science of nutrition to the maintenance of optimum health and the role of nutrition in the prevention and treatment of disease. Prerequisite: FCS 3755 or permission of the instructor. Restricted to BS in FCS: Dietetics Option.

Note: Dr. Yordanov returned to the meeting at 3:05 p.m.

#### 17. 17-77, FCS 4750, Advanced Human Nutrition (Revised Course).

Dr. Andrade presented the proposal and answered questions of the council. The council requested a revision to the proposal.

Mr. Young moved and Dr. Aylesworth seconded the motion to approve the proposal. The motion passed unanimously.

The proposal, with revision, was approved, effective Fall 2017, pending CGS approval.

FCS 4750. Advanced Human Nutrition. (3-0-3) On Demand. Emphasis on biochemical functions of nutrients in the study of human nutrition. Prerequisite: FCS 3755 or permission of the instructor. Restricted to students in the BS in FCS: Dietetics Option and MSND: Nutrition Education Option.

# 18. 17-78, BIO 3155G, Introduction to Evolutionary Medicine (New Course; Online Delivery).

Dr. Fritz presented the proposal. There were no questions.

Dr. Aylesworth moved and Dr. Paulson seconded the motion to approve the proposal. The motion passed unanimously.

The proposal was approved, effective Summer 2017.

NOTE: BIO 3155G will be placed under the Biological Sciences component of the Scientific Awareness segment of General Education.

BIO 3155G. Introduction to Evolutionary Medicine. (3-0-3) On Demand. Evolutionary Medicine Intro. A survey of current topics in evolutionary medicine, such as cancer treatment, antibiotic resistance, asthma and diseases of civilization will be explored and analyzed using the mechanisms of evolution natural selection, generation of biological traits and evolutionary history "mismatch" to current lifestyles affecting human biology today. Restricted to off-campus students that are non-Biological Sciences majors and minors.

# 19. 17-79, BIO 4833, Neurobiology of Diseases (New Course).

Dr. Britto presented the proposal. There were no questions.

## **Asian Studies Minor**

The interdisciplinary Asian Studies minor is composed of a core list of courses with Asia-specific content. Double counting coursework is permitted by the minor in Asian Studies. Coursework constituting the Asian Studies minor may include Honors Programs course equivalents; existing prerequisites for courses must be satisfied. Transfer credit will only be accepted towards the minor for up to six credit hours in Asian language study.

Date: March 9, 2017

As per CAA bylaws (VII.A.1.a.2.), "The Council on Academic Affairs shall have the responsibility and authority for making recommendations to the President relative to: Addition, deletion, or revision of all undergraduate programs other than teacher preparation programs which fall under the jurisdiction of the Council on Teacher Education." CAA considered the programs documented in Provost Blair Lord's letter to the Academic Program Elimination/Reorganization Review Committee and conducted a review of the following programs: B.A. in Philosophy, B.A. in Africana Studies, and B.S. in Adult and Community Education.

The focus of the review centered around three main considerations: (1) the centrality of the program to the University mission, (2) the impact that elimination of the program would have on students in other majors, minors, and concentrations, and (3) the overall quality of the program including the impact on the faculty's ability to provide service to the University should the program be eliminated.

After thorough review, CAA recommends the following:

#### For the B.A. in Philosophy

# **Recommendation: Program Retention**

Rationale: The program is central to EIU's mission to provide opportunities for students to learn the methods and results of free and rigorous inquiry in the humanities and to refine their abilities to become responsible citizens and leaders. The Philosophy program impacts several other interdisciplinary minors and programs including numerous General Education courses provided to the University. The quality of the program is characterized by the offering of comprehensive coverage of both analytic and continental philosophy within all areas and historical periods in the discipline, which is rarely found in other programs. Program elimination may make it difficult to retain and recruit qualified faculty within various areas of expertise to teach courses that are not part of a Philosophy major.

#### For the B.A. in Africana Studies

#### **Recommendation: Program Reorganization**

Rationale: While centrality to University mission is clear regarding EIU's commitment to diversity and inclusion as well as applied learning experiences, the program has limited impact on other students outside of the major. The overall quality of the program is difficult to discern. It is agreed that if the program was to be reorganized such that more interdisciplinary opportunities exist, it would have a greater overall impact on students and other programs.

# For the B.S. in Adult and Community Education Recommendation: Program Hiatus

Rationale: The program is central to EIU's mission in that it fosters opportunities for student-faculty scholarship and applied learning experiences. It is an innovative program that provides education and training for individuals to enhance community development across the state. If resources become available, the program could be revived and has great potential to attract students. Although the program has minimal impact on other majors, minors, or concentrations, it provides students in education a unique opportunity to become professionally prepared to have a positive impact on communities.
