Naval Training Station at Great Lakes, Ill., where he will have the opportunity to apply for one of the many trade courses offered in the Navy.

Connor is well known around Newton where his wife and other relatives live, and he is well qualified for the Naval Reserve which is now enlisting men between the ages of 17 and 50 years for short terms.
