**Two to Join the Group at Chicago
This Morning; Board Sending Out
Questionnaires to Registrants**

Twenty young men left Newton early this morning for Chicago, for induction into the United States Army. They will be joined at the induction station by two others. The group left here at 3:00 o'clock this morning by bus for Mattoon, where they took the train for Chicago.

After examination, those accepted will be immediately inducted into the army. Just where they will be sent from Chicago is unknown at this time. Most of the groups previously inducted, however, went to Camp Grant at Rockford or Fort Custer at Battle Creek, Michigan, for outfitting before being sent to other camps for training.
