

THREE TO GRADUATE FROM U. OF I., MONDAY 1942

Urbana-Champaign, May 28.—Receiving degrees from the University of Illinois next Monday (June 1) will be three students from Jasper county. The university's seventy-first annual commencement will be at 9:00 a. m. in George Huff gymnasium here.

President Arthur Cutts Willard will speak, and will confer some 2,000 baccalaureate degrees and 500 advanced degrees. Baccalaureate services will be at 4:00 p. m. Sunday, with Dr. Louis L. Mann, rabbi of Chicago Sinai congregational, speaking. Both commencement and baccalaureate services will be broadcast by the university's radio station, WILL (580 kc.).

The commencement originally was scheduled for June 15, but was advanced two weeks when the university accelerated its program in the war effort by eliminating the Easter vacation and condensing the final examination period.

For students in the university's Colleges of Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy, located in Chicago, a separate commencement will be held June 12 in the Chicago Civic Opera house. President Willard will speak and confer approximately 360 degrees.

Students from Jasper county who will receive degrees at the commencement here are: Miss Mary Culton of Newton, master of arts in education; and Bernard J. Kaufmann of Newton and Carl E. Chapman of Willow Hill, bachelor of science in agriculture.
