Selective Service Board Receives Its First October Call for Thirty Men to Go Tuesday, October 13

Thirty-nine men from Jasper county left Newton early Wednesday morning for the Chicago Induction station, where they were examined and, if accepted, were sworn into the United States Army. This was the third group to be called from Jasper county, totaling 101 men, during September, making this the largest month's induction ever made from here.

The local Selective Service Board has received its first October call, for thirty men to leave Newton, Tuesday, October 13. This, with enlistments, will bring the number of men in the armed services from Jasper county, nearly to the 750 mark, or almost a hundred above the peak of the first World war.
