EARNS COLLEGE HONORS IN SCHOLARSHIP AT U. OF I.

Urbana-Champaign, April 26. — Richard L. Worcester Jr. of Newton is one of the 920 outstanding scholars at the University of Illinois whose good scholastic work will be given special recognition Saturday at the nineteenth annual Honors day convocation.

While 920 names will be listed in the printed program, the number of students participating will be fewer. Many of the men have been called to arms, leaving their record of preeminent scholarship while they are using their university trained abilities to speed victory.

Phineas L. Windsor, director emeritus of the University Library, will speak at the convocation at 10:15 a. m. in the university auditorium. President Arthur Cutts Willard will preside. For the parents and friends who cannot be present, the proceedings will be broadcast by the university's radio station, WILL (580 k. c.)

Three types of recognition will be awarded. Foremost are the thirtyfour top ranking seniors, termed the "bronze tablet" group, whose names are to be inscribed on a permanent tablet in the university library along with the outstanding seniors of past years.

"College honors" will be awarded to 169 who are in the upper three per cent scholastically in each college and school of the university. Winners of this honor are entitled to wear the university's scholarship emblem. Mr. Worcester is in this group.

The third group, "class honors," consists of 751 students whose grades place them in the upper ten per cent of those enrolled within each college or school.
