

MRS. GEORGE F. BEVIS DIES VERY SUDDENLY

Mrs. Emma Adda Bevis passed away very suddenly at her home in Newton about 4:30 Monday morning as a result of a heart ailment. She had been in excellent health Sunday and had apparently risen to make a fire, when she suffered a heart attack. She called central and asked the operator to ask her son, Roy L. Bevis of Newton, to come at once, but by the time he arrived a few minutes later, he found her lying on the bed dead.

Mrs. Bevis was born in Ohio, October 30, 1858, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Lutz. She was married to George F. Bevis, who preceded her in death six years ago. They operated Bevis's restaurant at Newton for many years in the building next to the Press office, retiring about fifteen years ago.

She leaves four sons and two daughters, Mrs. William (Nettie) McConaha of San Bernardino, California, Delbert Bevis of Huntington Park, California, Daily G. and Harry Bevis of Los Angeles, California, Mrs. Jesse (Bess) Musgrove of Hillsboro, and Roy L. Bevis of Newton; nine grandchildren; one great grand-child; and many other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were unknown as the Press was printed.
