

DONALD J. WEBER HONORED AT REVIEW

Urbana-Champaign, January 18. — Having completed advanced course instruction in the Reserve Officers' Training Corps of the University of Illinois, Donald J. Weber of Newton was honored Friday afternoon at a review and special ceremonies for 151 cadets finishing their courses early through the university's war accelerated schedule.

After the end of January he will go to a three month special service school and then will be commissioned a second lieutenant in the Army of the United States. He will be in the cavalry.

At the ceremonies Friday, James H. Fisher of Chicago, took over the post of cadet colonel over the 4,700 University of Illinois cadets. He replaces Richard H. Moss of Chicago, who was one of the group completing their university work a semester early because of the accelerated program.

President Arthur Cutts Willard of the university and Colonel Leonard C. Sparks, commandant of the University R. O. T. C., spoke at the ceremonies, during which twelve awards were presented to outstanding cadets.
