DANIEL TABB DIES THURSDAY MORNING 1943

Daniel Upton Tabb, an aged resident of Newton, passed away Thursday morning, January 21, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Earl Wilson, on North Church street, after an extended illness. He was born in Hardin county, Kentucky, April 17, 1859, a son of Mr. and Mrs. John E. Tabb, and came to Jasper county in the fall of 1881 with his parents, making the trip in a covered wagon.

The Tabbs resided in Newton for several months and two sons died here during the winter. In the spring, they moved to Smallwood township, which remained his home until advancing age forced his retirement from active farming, after which he moved to Newton. Since the death of his wife September 25 last, he had made his home with his daughter.

He served eight terms as assessor of Smallwood township and held other offices of public trust. His father had been postmaster at Bogota under President Grover Cleveland.

He leaves two daughters and four sons, Mrs. Homer (Nellie) Willett, Mrs. Earl (Blanche) Wilson, Cecil, Samuel and John Tabb of Newton and Lowell Tabb of Martinsville, Indiana; one brother, Hardy Tabb of Berwyck; nineteen grand-children; eight great grand-children; two foster grand-children; and many other relatives and friends.

Funeral services will be held at the Reese Funeral Home in Newton, Saturday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock, conducted by the Rev. Thomas Spear of Bogota, and burial will be in Riverside cemetery beside his wife.
