

Twenty-Five Men Leave for Army

**Second Group During January
Sent to the Induction Station at
Chicago, Wednesday Morning**

Twenty-five men, the second group to be sent from Jasper county during January, left Wednesday morning for Chicago, where they were examined and inducted into the United States Army at the Chicago Induction station. Forty-four men were inducted from Jasper county on January 6.

The local Selective Service Board has received notice that men will be inducted into both the Army and Navy, effective immediately. Until in December, all Navy enlistments were on a voluntary basis and more recently, men have been permitted to volunteer through the draft boards.
