

## PATSY MONTANA TO BE AT FAIR

Patsy Montana, "America's No. 1 singing cowgirl," is one western star who is equally at ease on the back of a bucking bronco as she is before the microphone, on a Hollywood set, or on stage. Patsy was born on a ranch in Montana and her love for her native range prompted her to take Montana for a stage name when she entered radio.

The little lady with the big guitar and a repertoire of western songs has had a very interesting career. She was a featured soloist for leading radio stations in Hollywood and in New York but she really reached stardom at WLS in Chicago. She has made numerous records for Columbia and they are used extensively on radio stations throughout the country.

She has made western pictures and was featured with Gene Autrey, the singing cowboy, now Sergeant Gene Autrey of the United States Army Air Corps.

For her stage appearance, Patsy has an extensive wardrobe of cowgirl costumes and she has made over 5,000 such appearances and always has an interesting program for her admirers.

Miss Montana is the featured artist on the WLS Round-Up this season. She will have the support of radio stars from that station as well as other midwest stations. As an added attraction there will be Gessner's War Dogs, a troupe of highly trained canine soldiers making a few personal appearances before going on active duty for Uncle Sam.
