TWO JASPER BOYS REPORTED WOUNDED IN FRENCH BATTLE

SGT. KAN HAMILTON AND PFC. BYRL GRIFFY REPORTED ON

CASUALTY LIST

Two messages, telling of injuries to Jasper county men in the French theatre of war were received Tuesday and delivered to the families by Deputy Shriff Dyke Dillman.

One of the messages was to Mrs. Lucille Hamilton, Yale, advising her that her husband Sgt. K. S. Hamilton had been slightly injured in France on July 28. The other message was to Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Griffy, of Willow Hill, saying that their son, Pfc. Byrl Griffy had been slightly wounded on that same date.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Griffy and Mrs. Hamilton had already received letters from these boys telling of their wounds.

Private Griffy had told his parents that he had received a slight wound when hit on the arm by a piece of shrapnel, but intimated that the injury was nothing to cause alarm.

Sgt Hamilton in a letter since receiving his wounds, told his wife that he had received a slight injury to one of his hands.

Mrs. Hamilton, before her marriage to Sgt. Hamilton, was Miss Lucille Kinder of Newton.
