Sergeant George H. Staley of Near Falmouth Was Injured by German Bomb in Rome Recently

Sergeant George H. Staley, a son of Mr. and Mrs. George Staley of near Falmouth, is now under treatment at Hines' hospital, Chicago, for injuries received June 27 in Rome, when a German bomb exploded near him. He is rapidly improving and should be able to be home soon.

He received a crushed right leg below the knee and a broken bone in his foot when he was hurled some distance by the bomb explosion. All other men in his party were killed. His leg was placed in a cast but has so far improved that a part of the cast has now been removed, he writes his parents.

He arrived in the United States, August 6 and after six days at a Richmond, Virginia, hospital was sent to Chicago for treatment.
