Another Former Newton Boy Reported Missing aug. 24) 1944

Word of another Jasper county casualty in the fighting to liberate France from the clutches of the German war machine was received by Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence J. Huber of Ste. Marie Tuesday. A message from the office of the secretary of war said that their son, Staff Sergeant Vincent F. Huber, had been seriously injured in France on July 30.

Deputy Sheriff Dyke Dillman who carried the message to the family said the father told him that they had already heard from their son concerning his injuries, but there was nothing in his letter received a few days ago to indicate that his wounds were of a serious nature.

The letter written to his parents by Sgt. Huber stated that he had been injured and that he was being cared for in a hospital in England. The letter was in his own handwriting, the father said.

Roscoe Fasnacht Missing

Relatives here have received word that Roscoe Fasnacht, Jr., is reported missing in act on in the south Pacific area. He is a son of Roscoe Fasnacht of Richmond, Ind., and a grandson of Mrs. John Fasnacht of near Newton.

He was serving in the Marine Corps and held the rank of private first class.

He was well known in Newton, having made his home here with his grandmother after his father had movto Indiana.
