

Don Romack Is Killed in Action in Italy

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Romack and Grand-Son of Mrs S. L. Romack Was Killed April 5

Private Don Romack, 20 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Romack of Bement, formerly of near Rose Hill, and grand-son of Mrs. Sarah L. Romack of near Newton, was killed in action in Italy, April 5, relatives here have learned. The word was received from the War Department, May 4.

He was one of thirteen grand-sons and one great grand-son of Mrs. Romack Sr. in the armed services. He had been in the Army fifteen months and overseas since January.

Besides his parents and grandmother, he leaves five brothers and two sisters, Sidney Romack Jr. in the Army in New York, Theodore Romack in the Naval Diesel school at Champaign, Jack Romack in the Naval Signal school at Great Lakes, and George, Bobby, Sibyl and Faye Romack at home.

Lieutenant Riker Missing

Second Lieutenant David N. Riker of Oblong is reported missing in action since April 13 in the European theatre of operations, according to word received from the War Department this week. He has been in the Army since 1940 and overseas since February.

Lieutenant Musgrave Wounded

Second Lieutenant Charles B. Musgrave of Oblong was listed among a number of men wounded in the South Pacific area in a casualty list this week. The extent of his injuries are unknown.
