Three sons-in-law of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Clark of Newton, Machinist's Mate First Class Gordon Blade, Sergeant Delmer Lawler and Staff Sergeant Robert Dulgar, husbands of the former Ruth, Helen and Bessie Clark, respectively, met for two hours Sunday afternoon. Gordon was taking a train to an each coast port to join his ship at 4:00 o'clock and Robert came in from the east coast at 2:00 and they met at Olney for the first time since they entered the service.

Sergeant Lawler, who is stationed at Camp Ellis near Peoria, was here over the week end and the others were coming or returning from furloughs. Mrs. Blade accompanied her husband to the coast.

Foreign Money

Mr. Blade brought a quantity of money with him, which he had picked up at the various ports his tanker had touched during the more than a year that he has been at sea. Included are paper money and silver, bronze and nickel coins.

Among these are American dollar bills, printed as invasion money with yellow instead of blue seals, Canadian and Trinidad one dollar bills, French 100-franc notes from North Africa, a silver peso from Venezuela, and silver, nickel and bronze coins from Ireland, England and Africa. Included were the new English bronze three pence piece and the Irish square nickel coin, both rather rare in this country.
