Severely Burned

Mrs. Sam Wilson of south of Newton has been notified by the Navy Department that her son, Private First Class Lloyd D. Wilson, was recently severely burned somewhere in the Pacific area. He is in the Marine Air Force and entered the service January 3, 1944, going overseas in May.

Mr. Wilson Sr. is in Ohio, where he is employed.

Wounded in Action

Hidalgo, November 2.—Word has been received at Hidalgo that Harry Dulgar Jr. and Ray Vanatta had been wounded in action. Harry is thought to be in France and to be back in action now. Ray was wounded in Germany, October 13 and is now in a hospital in France. A letter was received from him and he praised the doctors and nurses very highly for the good care the boys are getting.

Killed in Action

Noble, November 1. — Word has been received by W. E. Redmon of near Noble, that his brother, Private Paul Redmon, was killed in action in Germany on October 9. No particulars were given.

Paul was seriously injured on June 26 in France, but according to word received from him later, he had returned to action. This was but a short time before his death.

He was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Stephen Redmon of Noble township.
