Eldon Dewhirst Is
Prisoner of War *april*
11,
1945

Mrs. Eldon Dewhirst has received a card from her husband, Private First Class Dewhirst, stating that he was well but was a German prisoner. He added that he was well treated. It was written from a prison camp inside Germany on January 10.

He has been reported missing in action since December 18 in Luxembourg with the Thirtieth Infantry division during von Runstedt's offensive.

He said: "I am well. I hope you haven't worried too much about me. Get in touch with the Red Cross at home and send me as many packages as you can—clothing, food and cigarettes."

He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Dewhirst of Newton. A brother, Private First Class James Dewhirst, is in Germany.

Charles Fulk Is Prisoner

Noble, April 16.—Mrs. Charles Fulk of Noble has received word that her husband, Private First Class Fulk, is a prisoner of war. He had previously been reported missing in action during the Belgian bulge battle in December.
