As Nurse In England

The 228th Station Hospital, Sherborne, Dorsetshire, England — After caring for 22,924 patients, thousands of whom were battle casualties, this United States Army station hospital has completed its work in England.

Among those who helped in the operation of the hospital was First Lieutenant Marian L. Chaney, of Yale, Illinois, a general duty nurse.

This hospital unit, which is commanded by Lieutenant Colonel J. Kingsley MacDonald of Charlotte, North Carolina, has been operating in a hospital plant built by the British on part of what was once Sir Walter Raleigh's estate. It is located less than a mile from the ruins of his castle.

Lieutenant Chaney's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Otto Chaney, are residents of Yale, Illinois.
