Robert Y. Robb, who was a civilian internee at Santo Tomas prison camp in Manila from the capture of the city by the Japanese until February of this, year, is visiting his mother, Dr. Winifred A. Robb of Newton. He has recovered his weigh, although he was suffering from beriberi and other vitamin deficiency diseases when freed. Recently he has been at Los Angeles, California.

Mr. Robb was editor of the Philippine Free Press in Manila and broadcast on the radio during the Jap attacks. He managed to preserve some of the English language newspapers in Manila during the occupation, although most of the files were burned when the city was set on fire by the Japs as the Americans closed in.
