

PFC. FLOYD E. PRICE AWARDED MEDAL

CITED FOR HEROISM DURING D-
DAY INVASION IN FRANCE

WITH THE 449TH MILITARY POLICE COMPANY, FRANCE — For entering a heavily mined field, on invasion day, to rescue a seriously injured sailor who had entered the mined field and set off a mine, Private First Class Floyd E. Price, son of Mr. and Mrs. John N. Price, Newton, Illinois, was recently awarded the Soldier's Medal

Veteran of sixteen months on foreign soil, he directed traffic on the beach under constant enemy fire during Amphibious landing in France on D-Day. His unit was the first Military Police Company to make an Amphibious landing with an assault organization.

Prior to his induction February 19-43, Pfc. Price, was employed in Chicago, Illinois, as a screw machine operator.
