

Mr. and Mrs. A. O. Cunefare, of Gila have given four sons to the service since the beginning of the war and two of these have paid the great price of peace and freedom.

The first of these was Lt. Noel Cune fare, a bomber pilot, who was killed when his plane was shot down over Germany in July, 1944. The other was Chief Gunner's Mate, Arlan Cunefare who was reported Missing in Action in a naval engagement in the Pacific last week.

The two other sons in the service are S/Sgt. Freeman Cunefare, who is stationed at Fort Sheridan, Ill., and F/2c Elmer Cunefare who is serving in the navy on the west coast.

Arlan, who was reported missing last week, had served an enlistment in the navy before war was declared, and enlisted a second time the day after the Japs paid their treacherous and unexpected sneak attack on Pearl Harbor.
