T/5 Clyde Resch, a Newton soldier who is serving in France, writes a very interesting letter to relatives here concerning army life in Europe. In a letter to his aunt, Mrs. Margaret Boston, he says "I finally got my stripes. I told you I would let you know when I did. I have also received my good conduct ribbon, believe it or not".

He says that he expects to be transferred from his present location at Thonvill France, and while he rather thinks he will be sent to Germany, he realizes that it could as well be "some other place."

He said that he learned that "Bub" Faller, of Newton is in the army post-office in Luxembourg, but has seen him. His company has been awarded the Bronze Star for participation in the battle for Germany.
