

Two Men ^{Mar. 16, 1945} Are Killed in Germany

**Edgar E. Andrews of Newton,
and Donald Short of Hunt City
Make the Supreme Sacrifice**

Private First Class Edgar E. Andrews was killed in action in Germany, March 3, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Andrews of Newton, were notified by the War Department, Tuesday. He was serving with a Tank battalion attached to General George Patton's Thirtieth army.

Besides his parents, he leaves four brothers and four sisters, Perry and Harry Andrews of Gary, Indiana, Foster Andrews of Newton, Private Ky Andrews in France or Germany, Alice, Helen and Charlene Andrews at home, and Miss Maybelle Andrews of Olney.

He was born August 8, 1920, at Newton, and had been in the Army since October 20, 1942.

Donald Short Is Killed

Word was received Thursday morning from the War Department that Donald Short of near Hunt City had been killed in action in Germany on February 28. He is a son of Perry Short of Chrisman, a former resident of Jasper county. His mother preceded him in death.

He was born near Hunt City August 23, 1923, and was inducted into the service January 20, 1943, going overseas about a year ago. He had been unable to write home recently about what he was doing, but he is known to have been in the Infantry.

Besides his father, he leaves four sisters, Mrs. Opal Ives, Mrs. Norma Jean Schmidt and Mrs. Wanda Rogers of Newton and Mrs. Lucille Moran in Georgia.

Hospitalized in France

Private Paul G. Wheat, son of Mr. and Mrs. Horace Wheat of Newton,



who was with the Seventh army, half way across France, is now in a hospital, somewhere in France. He has been hospitalized since November.

Mr. and Mrs. Wheat also have another son, Roy E. Wheat, somewhere in England. Both boys would be glad to hear from their friends back home.
