Private First Class John B. Bush and Private First Class Harold Race Get Purple Hearts

Mrs. Lillian Fischer of Yale has been notified by the War Department that her son, Private First Class Harold Race, was seriously wounded in action in Burma and is now hospitalized in Assam, India. He was serving with a Cavalry division. He has been awarded the Purple Heart medal.

Mrs. John B. Bush of Ingraham vicinity has received word from the War Department that her husband, Private First Class Bush, was wounded in action in Germany. A shell fragment struck him in the right knee and he is now in a military hospital making normal improvement. He has been awarded the Purple Heart medal.
