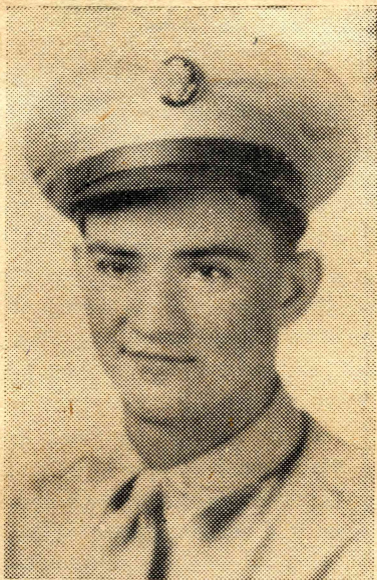


KY ANDREWS DIES OF WOUNDS



Pvt. Ky Andrews, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Andrews of Newton died of wounds received in battle in Germany on April 13, according to word his parents received from the War Department. He is the second son of Mr. and Mrs. Andrews to lost his life in Germany.

Second Son of Newton Family To Lose Life In Line Of Duty

Mr. and Mrs. Charles Andrews received a message from the War Department Friday, stating that another of their sons, Private Ky W. Andrews, had died in Germany of wounds received in action. The message came just a month and ten days after one that told of their son Edgar being killed in action.

The message from Adjutant General J. A. Ulio stated that Ky died of wounds on April 13. The parents had previously been notified that their son had been seriously wounded.

Ky was 21 years of age last February and had been in service two years in March. He had his training in Camp Hood and Camp Barkley. For a time before leaving the states he was in a paratroop division, but later transferred to a tank division with which he was serving at the time of receiving his fatal wounds.

He landed in France last February 1 and was sent immediately to the western German front.

For some time before being inducted into service Ky was employed during his spare time as a delivery boy at the Kinsel Grocery. He was a sophomore at Newton Community High School at the time he went into service, and would have been a member of the senior class that will graduate next month.

The grief-stricken parents had only a few days ago received the Bronze Star medal that had been awarded posthumously to their son Edgar. It is probable that Ky had never learned of Edgar's fate at the time of his death.
