Hallowilloween: Netarious Silliness from Calet Brown

Before Reading

- Talk about rhyme, rhythm, and repetition in poetry.
- Brainstorm some words that rhyme with common Halloween words

(ghost, vampire, bat, mummy, etc.)

 Discuss the unknown vocabulary seen in the poems and define it. (nefarious, epitaph, fouling, hexes, conical, heed, dawdle, grackle, gorges, etc.)

During Reading

• Tell the children to listen for rhyming words, the different rhythms of the poems, and repetition.

After Reading

- Put children into small groups and have them draw a Halloween character from a jar.
- Have them create their own poem about the character they chose.
 - Encourage them to use rhyme and/or repetition in their poems.
- Let them use the poems from the book as a guide if needed.
- Have the groups illustrate their poems and then share them.
 - Combine the poems and illustrations into a classroom Hallowilloween book.
