



How to calculate your 2015-16 EIU/UPI dues!

Here's how UPI's yearly dues for bargaining unit members are calculated

1. Take the member's annual base salary and multiply it times **0.6%**;
2. Any member whose base salary is **\$57,861.00** or more will pay the total amount that UPI pays to its affiliates, **\$580.10**, in addition to the amount in #1.

OR

3. Any member whose base salary is less than **\$57,861.00** per year but more than or equal to **\$14,889** will pay **\$309.27** in affiliation dues in addition to the amount in # 1.

OR

4. Any member whose base salary is less than **\$14,889** per year but more than or equal to **\$9,040** will pay **\$173.86** in affiliation dues in addition to the amount in # 1.

OR

5. Any member earning less than **\$9,040** per year will pay **\$106.15** in affiliation dues in addition to the amount in #1.
6. Then divide the resulting total in line 2, 3, 4 or 5 by the number of a member's pay periods per year.

The formula would look like the following...

$$\frac{0.6\% \times \text{base salary} + \text{affiliation dues}}{\text{Pay periods per year}} = \frac{\text{dues per}}{\text{pay period}}$$
